4-H Zsuite Enrollment Instructions

With a new 4-H year upon us we must begin a new enrollment period. The New Mexico State 4-H Office will be transitioning to a new enrollment system called Zsuites. If you already have a Zsuites account for Clover Academy you will be able to login like normal and add youth to your profile.

1) Click the 'Sign Up' link on the ZSuite homepage.

2) Fill Out The Form. Note That Each Household Account Has A 'Primary' Account. This Is typically the Primary parent account, which has some administrative functions that club member accounts do not. This is why we ask that you enter a 4 digit pin code, which assures our parents that no unauthorized access to the primary account occurs.

3) Note that the email address entered will be the email address used for ALL members under this household account. This way it's easier to remember your login for ZSuite. Your email address can be used ONLY ONCE, so please use an email address that is easy to remember.

4) Once you complete the form, click the 'Let's Go' button.

5) You will now be redirected to the Dashboard for the primary account.

6) Click the Green '+ HOUSEHOLD MEMBER' button.

Enter the associated members name, birthdate and club

7) Return to Dashboard and click enroll member and enter address, emergency contact and other misc. information.

8) Click next, this will take you to the waiver section.

9) All waivers can be digitally signed! All you have to do is type your name in the provided boxes. All forms are the same forms from previous years.

——If at any point you need to save for later click that button at the bottom of your enrollment. To get back into the enrollment go to the dash board click the child's name and continue enrollment.——-

10) Click next, this will take you to the club section, from here you can add projects.

11) Click Submit, you are done with enrollments!

The idea of creating a portfolio record of project activities and accomplishments has been around since the beginning of the 4-H program because it is such a valuable educational tool. Ideally, a 4-H record book should be a "brag book" of everything a 4-Her does and learns and eventually become a treasured family keepsake.

The 4-H program prides itself on developing life skills in youth, and the process of completing a quality record book supports skills such as planning, goal-setting, decision-making, problem-solving, communication, leadership, citizenship, and of course record keeping. There is clearly much to be gained through 4-H record books, but the key is to make it less painful by breaking it down into small, easy to handle steps that are spread throughout the program year.

In these classes we will learn all of the key information needed for a complete, and successful record book. We will work with you to make sure that your record book is ready to turn in on November 12.
